Multnomah Case Initiation

Electronically filing initiating documents in Multnomah County is slightly different from electronically filing initiating documents with other circuit courts in Oregon. In all instances, when initiating a case through File and Serve you must select a location from the case information screen, for example Yamhill or Linn. Multnomah County has nine locations to chose from. What Multnomah location you chose will depend on the kind of case you are initiating. This guide will walk you through selecting the correct Multnomah location for starting your case through File and Serve.

NOTE: When filing into a case that already exists the system automatically selects the correct Multnomah location.

- 1) After logging into File and Serve, from the Filer Dashboard, Click
- 2) From the Case Information screen click

- *Identity Record* although this case type is a civil case type, it is found at the Multnomah Domestic Relations location and the case category is Civil.
- Case Category Options without available Case Types
 - Contempt of Court all locations have this case category option. If it is selected there will be no available case types to choose because contempt cases cannot be initiated through File and Serve.
 - Criminal all locations have this case category option. If it is selected there are no available case types to choose because criminal cases cannot be initiated through File and Serve.
- 4) Each Location, when selected, will provide for a set of Category options. If you cannot determine what category to choose to find the proper case type, consult the above table.
- 5) The remainder of the filing process follows standard File and Serve procedures.

Note: Subsequent filings do not require the filer to choose a location as the existing case is already at the location it belongs and cannot be changed.
